Heights are above mean high water springs or mean higher high water, as appropriate.

The capital letter (P) or (T) after the number of any notice denotes a preliminary or temporary notice respectively, which are contained separately at the end of the permanent notices. A star (*) adjacent to the number of a notice indicates that the notice is based on original information.

Introduction

Seafarer, a digital coloured facsimile of Australian navigational charts on a single CDROM for use with authorised, compatible Electronic Charting Systems (ECS). However, mariners should note that *Seafarer* is a navigation aid only, it has not been certified by IMO as a replacement for the paper chart.

Product Compatibility

The Seafarer format is Hydrographic Chart Raster Format (HCRF) which is fully compatible with the Admiralty Raster Chart Service (ARCS). This compatibility enables the mariner to take full advantage of the global service offered by ARCS.

Seafarer Packaging

Seafarer will be packaged specifically to support the needs of the Australian mariner and will be sold as follows:

Australia Pack: This pack will include all Australian navigational charts (total coverage December 1997).

Regional Packs: These packs will enable mariners to traverse major regional areas such as the Queensland coast (approx 60 charts).

Day Mariner Packs: These packs have been designed to cater for the *day mariner* and provide coverage for specific areas of interest (approx 10 charts).

Seafarer Release

Seafarer will be available, initially, in an Australia Pack, 2 Regional Packs and 16 Day Mariner Packs. Single charts within these packs will also be available for purchase. Additional packs will be become available through 1997 with full coverage of Australia by December.
