The range quoted for a light is its nominal range. Fog signals are sounded only during thick or foggy weather, unless otherwise stated Depths are with reference to the chart datum of each chart. Heights are above mean high water springs or mean higher high water, as appropriate.

The capital letter (P) or (T) after the number of any notice denotes a preliminary or temporary notice respectively, which are contained separately at the end of the permanent notices. A star (*) adjacent to the number of a notice indicates that the notice is based on original information.

AMSA & DOTQ Notice 361/97 (AH 57/107)

Mariners are advised that the Mandatory Ship Reporting System (SRS) radar systems are now fully operational. Within the SRS, radar is used to assist in the monitoring with the mandatory reporting requirements and as an additional source of ship traffic information to enable the SRS to better interact with participating ships. Radars are located on Hammond Island and Warraber Island in the Torres Strait, Green Island off Cairns and Penrith Island off Mackay and are remoted to REEFCENTRE at Hay Point. At REEFCENTRE, radar data is interfaced with the SRS traffic information module to provide an enhanced surface picture of shipping operations in the radar coverage areas.

Mariners are reminded that, when interacting with participating ships, the SRS provides an Information Service. The provision of information by the SRS to participating ships does not in any way relieve any person on the ship from their responsibilities in relation to the safe navigation of the ship. In particular, it does not relieve a ship from keeping a proper lookout in accordance with the Colregs.
