MRCC Turku, MRSC Helsinki and MRSC Vaasa maintain a continuous listening watch on international distress frequencies including VHF DSC Ch 70, VHF Ch 16 and MF DSC 2187.5 kHz. The call by radio is "Rescue Centre" Turku, Helsinki or Vaasa.</p>
<p><b>TeleMedical Assistance Service:</b> Contact via MRCC Turku, MRSC Helsinki or MRSC Vaasa. Possible consultation languages: English, Finnish and Swedish. The social and health authorities provide advice.</p>
